### Results of the final evaluation for students carried out in May 2017 in the Elementary School "OŠ Marije i Line" in Umag, Croatia

42 students in total have completed the Final evaluation, thus showing their interest in participating in our common project P.L.A.C.E.S. In the Croatian school, students completed the evaluation in English. In continuation is the summary of their answers which have been collected by using Google Forms.

- 1) Are you satisfied with the activities you have completed during this project?
  - 83.3% (35) of the students have answered positively
  - 11,9% (5)of the students said they were partly satisfied
  - 4,8% (2) of the students answered they weren't satisfied.
- 2) Have you taken part in any mobilities abroad?
  - 469% have answered positively.
  - 13% have answered negatively.

## 3) If your answer to the previous question was "yes" do you think that your involvement in these activities was successful?

- > 69.4% said their involvement was successful
- > 27.8% said they "didn't know"
- > 2.8% said "no".

### 4) Have you improved your English by being involved in this project?

47.6% (20) students gave a positive answer, 21.4% (9) students answered they have improved English "to an average extent", 26.2 (11) students answered they have improved English "a little" and 4.8% (2) said they didn't improve their English at all.

## 5) By working on this project, have you acquired some new ICT skills or improved the existing ones?

- ➤ 52.4% (22) said they have acquired some new ICT skills or improved the existing ones
- ➤ 31% (13) said they have improved the exiosting ICT skills
- ➤ 16.7% (7) said they haven't learned anything new.

- Word : 26.2% (11) students
- Powerpoint: 52.4% (22)
- Photostory: 14.3% (6)

- Making Glogsters: 28.6% (12)

- Using Prezzi: 2.4% 1 student
- Nothing: 2.4% 1 student

# 7) Have you improved your knowledge about the culture and languages of the countries involved in the project?

Here is what the students responded:

- 42.9% (18) "yes, to some extent"
- 33.3% (14) "yes, to a great extent"

> 23.8% (10) – "a little".

- Legendary puppets: 5 students (11.9%)
- Thematic albums/comic books/animated booklets/slide shows/presentations: 17 students (40.5%)
- E-books by using the web tool "Storyjumper": 21 students (50%)
- ➤ Glogsters: 10 students (23.8%)
- Kotobee e-book: 5 students (11.9%)
- Videos about legends, making rap: 1 students (2.4%).
